SUMMER CAMP 2010 COMING SOON!



The Session has approved Summer Camp 2010 to be held at Colonial this summer for children in our community. This is a real service to the children and parents of low-income households during the time when children are not in school. This will be the fourth year for Colonial's summer day camp and all of you will be needed to make it a success. Be thinking of ways you can help. . . more later.

Over Six Thousand Sandwiches and 852 Little Debbies prepared for homeless!

Colonial's Sandwich Mission was started April 25, 2005, with 16 workers at that time. It was funded by donations. Since that time 6,394 sandwiches, 852 Little Debbies, 2 crates of apples, 77 bananas, 81 cupcakes, 100 packages of cheese puffs, 300 boiled eggs, 535 cookies, 600 packages of potato chips, 20 cakes, and 100 packages of peppermint candy have been prepared for the homeless by Colonial and distributed by the St. Vincent de Paul mission on Jackson.

They meet in the Fellowship Hall on the second Monday of every month at 9:00 a.m. and would love for you to join them.
