Day Camp

Heading into its fourth year, the camp area needed desperately to be renovated. But, there was no money in the budget for renovations. Along came Keller Williams Realty Memphis East needing a project for their annual RED Day, short for "Renew, Energize and Donate," created by Keller Williams Realty Inc. to give back to its communities across the U.S. and Canada.
